

## Preventive measures against the spread of the Coronavirus 2019 (COVID-19)

Lycée Français International de Bangkok adopts the measures decreed by OPEC/MOE and the Ministry of Public Health in order to prevent the spread of COVID-19 as follows:

1. The 12 countries or territories currently listed as at-risk by the Ministry of Public Health are China, Hong Kong, Macau, Singapore, Japan, Taiwan, South Korea, Iran, Italy, France, Germany and Spain.
2. The personnel, students, parents of students (or a member of the household) who have travelled to the countries listed by the Thai authorities must declare their situation and observe a 14-day self-quarantine (from the day of return to Thailand).
3. The list (for staff, students and parents) is updated daily on the basis of the individual declaration.
4. A temperature check of the students and staff is carried out every morning at the entrance of the LFIB. All staff and students having fever will not be admitted to the school. The parents will be notified to pick up their children. The school is restricting access to external visitors on a case-by-case basis.
5. A 0.5% hygienic solution hand disinfection at the school entry and the entrance to the school canteen. Alcohol gels are placed at various locations throughout the school.
6. Frequent hand washing is encouraged by teachers and posters displayed throughout the school.
7. The cleaning is enforced every day, and a big cleaning is carried out every Saturday.
8. As a precaution, all school trips and sporting events have been postponed. All educational visits - trainings, conferences, seminars, study trips, extra classes and international researches. This also includes meetings for the purpose of educational assurance and inspection visits are postponed

Other events where there are likely to be large numbers of people coming onsite from outside the school community.

9. Whenever students show signs of illness at school they are taken to the medical center. Here the nursing team evaluates them and decides on the next steps. They are kept safely isolated in one of our medical rooms. Specialist medical assistance will be sought as appropriate. If necessary, parents are asked to come and collect their child

In some circumstances, we may ask for a doctor's medical certificate confirming that a child is safe to return to school once they feel better.

10. The school leadership team are meeting regularly and monitoring the situation closely alongside close cooperation with the Ministry of Public Health to gain the most up-to-date information which will be posted on the school website
