Pollution action protocol



We would like to draw the attention of new families to the LFIB Pollution Action Plan. In the event of a pollution peak, this plan is activated and has immediate consequences for your children's school life: indoor recess, outdoor recess for pupils wearing masks and the cancellation of outdoor sports sessions, etc.

It is essential that each pupil has PM 2.5 pollution masks in his or her bag (a model of your choice; LFIB does not provide masks for pupils) from November so that they can continue to play outside with masks if the threshold allows.

REMINDERS

<u>Photos at school</u>



As you know, image rights are a sensitive issue. We would like to remind you that during school events, you are not allowed to take photos of pupils (other than your child). Similarly, when you come to school for an appointment or to accompany an outing, you must not use your camera.

Finally, we have noticed that in maternelle some parents take photos of pupils playing in the playground from the reception area, or film the classroom from the windows in the recordings morning. These are authorised either.

We thank you in advance for following these instructions out of respect for the choices made by families and staff with regard to image rights.
